

#### A message from the Artistic Director

Dear Angels & Friends:

After celebrating the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of **Ópera de San Miguel** and the 15<sup>th</sup> **Concurso San Miguel** last year, we did a survey with our Angels and friends entitled "Visions of the future", as well as three focus groups. One of the main takeaways from those inquiries with our donors and sponsors was the suggestion to collaborate with other cultural organizations in San Miguel.

So, on January 5, 2025, we embarked on our first co-sponsored event, at the request of our longtime sponsors and friends, Camino Silvestre's Jim McKeever and Alfredo García-Lucio: a preview of the new opera by composer Derek Bermel and writer Sandra Cisneros, based on her best-selling novel *The House on Mango Street*, which will have its world premiere at the Glimmerglass Festival in New York this summer. The event, that took place at Aguamiel, was a fund-raiser for the **San Miguel Book Fair (Felisma).** 

On January 25 we combined two of our traditional events as one single fund-raiser: the **Mexico-Canada Concert** and the **Baroque Concert** at Santa Amalia ranch, near Comonfort, featuring two past Concurso singers, a OSM Prize winner at **Les Jeunes Ambassadeurs Lyriques** in Montreal, and our very own Santa Amalia Baroque Ensemble.

Speaking of Les Jeunes Ambassadeurs Lyriques, our good friend and long-time judge at Concurso San Miguel, Alain Nonat, sadly passed away on December 31, 2024, after a long illness. We have been notified that his legacy will continue going forward, as will our partnership.

On February 7 and 8, for the very first time, we participated with **Pro Música** and **Ópera Insurgente** in support of their production of Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*, an endeavor we hope to continue going forward, as many of the singers that have participated in these operas for the past 15 years have been alumni of **Concurso San Miguel**.

After this year's 16<sup>th</sup> Concurso we will continue our outreach with the larger community of

Guanajuato, as the **Teatro del Bicentenario** has once again invited us to hold our **Winners Recital** in León, on March 15.

Finally, this summer it is our intention to participate once again with a concert at the **3**<sup>rd</sup> **Festival de las Artes de San Miguel (FASMA)**, as an opportunity to extend our presence in beyond our traditional winter season, and reach out to new audiences.

San Miguel de Allende continues to be a hub for culture and the arts in the Bajío region of central Mexico, and **Opera de San Miguel** will continue on its mission to discover and support the unique and talented voices of young Mexican singers, thanks to the continued support of our Angels, and the hospitality of this historic theater, named after the famous Mexican soprano Ángela Peralta, known as the "Mexican Nightingale", who inaugurated the theater in 1873.

In late 2024 we received applications from 152 singers from 26 of the country's 32 states, and in early January we auditioned 78 of them to select the 8 finalists and 2 special guests you will hear this evening.

#### **Charles Oppenheim**

Artistic Director Ópera de San Miguel AC



Considered the very first opera in history, Dafne by composer Jacopo Peri and librettist Ottavio Rinuccini was premiered at the Palazzo Corsi in Florence during the Carnival of 1597. Based on Ovid's Metamorphoses, it tells the story of the the nymph Daphne, who flees from the Olympian deity Apollo when he falls in love with her, and she turns into a laurel tree, becoming the symbol of poetry, music and freedom.



ÓPERA DE SAN MIGUEL, AC (OSM) is devoted to discovering and nurturing the careers of Mexico's most talented and promising young opera singers. Through Concurso San Miguel, OSM promotes the professional aspirations of young artists through scholarships for advanced study, career development and performing opportunities, providing professional mentoring, and awarding cash prizes at its annual voice competition. Since the first Concurso in 2008, Ópera de San Miguel has become one of the most recognized opera competitions in the country for promoting the careers of young Mexican singers.

All funds that support the work of **Ópera de San Miguel** are raised privately with donations from individuals and local business sponsors in San Miguel de Allende. Our major donors are the **Angels of Ópera de San Miguel**, the backbone of our programs.

More than 200 past finalists and winners of Concurso San Miguel have achieved a level of national and international success that was previously unheard of for Mexican singers. Our singers have made their debuts at the Palacio de Bellas Artes in Mexico City and other important venues across the country, as well as in theaters in the U.S. such as the Metropolitan Opera of New York, Chicago, Houston, Los Angeles, New Orleans, San Francisco and Santa Fe, among other American cities; in Canada they have appeared in Banff, Haliburton, Montreal, Quebec and Toronto; in Europe: Aachen, Barcelona, Basel, Bologna, Eisenach, Hannover, Innsbruck, Lubeck, Meiningen, Naples, Regensburg, Stuttgart, Taormina, Zurich... throughout the Netherlands, and even Abu Dhabi.

These young singers have given concerts in Amsterdam, Bratislava, Istanbul, Moscow and several cities in China. In addition, several OSM alumni have received full scholarships to the Academy of Vocal Arts in Philadelphia (AVA), the Ryan Opera Center in Chicago, and have participated in several young artist programs, from Los Angeles, California, to Valencia, Spain, and in voice contests such as the Metropolitan Opera Laffont Competition in New York, the Carlo Morelli National Competition in Mexico City, and the Maria Callas Competition in São Paulo, Brazil.

These results could not be boasted if it were not for the generosity of the **Angels of Ópera de San Miguel**. In appreciation of their support, they all receive priority seating not only for the Concurso but for all the concerts and fund-raisers we organize during our winter season, among other benefits.

We gladly accept all donations, but we especially invite you to consider joining our Angels program for a minimum contribution of \$1,000 US dollars. In addition, U.S. citizens who contribute through the **San Miguel Community Foundation** receive an annual tax-deductible receipt that they can submit with their annual return. 

#### The Opera de San Miguel Master Teacher Program

A unique feature of Concurso San Miguel, the Master Teacher Program gives our finalists the opportunity to work with international opera figures through Master Classes, career advice and mentoring. The insights that our Master Teachers impart, gained from their extensive professional careers, are an invaluable experience to the contestants.

#### Jane Bunnell

Master Teacher

Mezzo-soprano **Jane Bunnell** joined the faculty of Michigan State University's College of Music in August 2015 as professor of voice. She has enjoyed an illustrious international career for 40 years. She has an especially long association with the Metropolitan Opera where she has sung 30 roles in more than 420 performances, including new productions of *Ariadne auf Naxos, Otello, Les Troyens, Faust,* and *Romeo et Juliette,* and the Met premieres of Nico Muhly's *Marnie,* Britten's *A Midsummer Nights' Dream* and Wolf-Ferrari's *Sly.* She has also recorded with the Met for Sony/BMG and has toured Europe and Japan. She is frequently heard on Sirius XM radio.

She has sung with the opera companies of Toulouse, Vienna, Cologne, Schwetzingen and the Bellas Artes Opera in Mexico, and with American companies as Houston Grand Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, San Diego Opera, Minnesota Opera, Florida Grand Opera and New York City Opera. Ms. Bunnell has collaborated with such notable conductors as James Levine, Valery Gergiev, Seiji Ozawa, and Robert Shaw. She has appeared in concert with the Boston Symphony, Lincoln Center's Mostly Mozart Festival, the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, the Atlanta Symphony, and the Minnesota Orchestra.

Ms. Bunnell was on the faculty of New York University for nine years before joining the faculty at DePaul University from 2006 to 2015. Her students have sung with the Metropolitan Opera, Opera Toledo, and Dayton Opera, and they have been young artists at the Ryan Center in Chicago, LA Opera, Lyric Opera of Kansas City, Milwaukee Opera, and Opera Madison in Wisconsin as well as creating new music in LA and New York.

#### Mario Alberto Hernández Resident Pianist

Mario Alberto has been OSM's Resident Pianist since its inception in 2008. His inexhaustible energy, talent as a pianist, vast knowledge of operatic repertoire and style, and unique ability to communicate with singers have made him an invaluable member of our team. Maestro Mario Alberto has been a Piano Accompanist and Assistant Conductor of the Festival Internacional Cervantino, the Festival of Sinaloa, and the Mexico City Festival. He served on the faculty of the Bellas Artes Superior School of Music, in Mexico City, for 34 years.









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Cori Ellison has served as Staff Dramaturg at Santa Fe Opera, the Glyndebourne Festival, and the New York City Opera. Active in developing contemporary opera, she leads Opera Lab, a unique practical training program for composers, librettists, and performers at the Juilliard School, where she serves on the Vocal Arts faculty. She is a founding faculty member of American Lyric Theater's Composer Librettist Development Program, and has participated in the Yale Institute for Music Theatre. She has served as production dramaturg for several projects in the United States and Salzburg. She is a faculty member at the Ravinia Steans Music Institute Program for Singers and has taught and lectured for schools, performance venues, and media outlets worldwide. She creates supertitles for opera companies across the English-speaking world, and helped launch the Met Titles simultaneous translation system. She has often written for the New York Times and has contributed to books including The New Grove Dictionary of Opera and The Compleat Mozart.

Jens Neundorff von Enzberg studied musicology, theater marketing and cultural sciences in Berlin and Leipzig. In 1992 he started working as a dramaturg for all genres at the South Thuringian State Theater in Meiningen. In 1996 he moved to the Semperoper in Dresden where he also worked as a dramaturg. In addition, he was entrusted with the artistic direction of the "kleine szene": the experimental stage of the Semperoper. From 2000 to 2007, Jens was chief dramaturg for music theater and a member of the artistic direction of the Bonn Theater as well as artistic director of the experimental music theater series "Bonn chance!" From the seasons 2007-08 to 2011-12. Jens worked as opera director and music theater dramaturg at the Braunschweig State Theater. At the beginning of the 2012-13 season, he became intendant at the Regensburg Theater and headed the fivesection theater with great artistic and economic success until 2020-21. Since the beginning of the 2021-22 season, Jens Neundorff von Enzberg has been the intendant of the Meiningen and Eisenach State Theaters.

Charles Oppenheim has a degree in Communication from the Ibero-American University in Mexico City, and has worked as a journalist and a translator for 47 years in magazines, newspapers, radio, television and the Internet. Since his debut at the Palacio de Bellas Artes in Mexico City in 2005, he has sung over 40 operatic roles for bass, mainly by composers such as Donizetti, Mozart, Rossini and Verdi, as well as 12 symphonic works and oratorios, in the main theaters and with the principal orchestras of Mexico. He has also been a judge, a member of the audition team, a simultaneous translator, and an advisory board member of the Concurso San Miguel since 2013, and is the artistic director of Opera de San Miguel since 2020.
